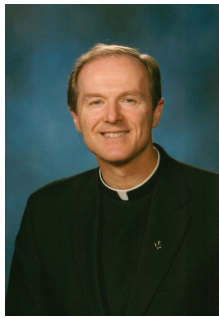

1. SPECIAL WEEK

On behalf of Holy Savior parish, I have invited Deacon Alex Jones for presentations the evenings of Feb 8, 9, 10, and 11. Please mark your calendars and plan to attend this special week of activities at Holy Savior!

BIOGRAPHY

From April 1975 to December 2000 Deacon Jones was the senior minister of two churches in the city of Detroit: Zion Congregational Church of God in Christ (1975-1982), the second oldest Pentecostal church in Michigan, and Maranatha Christian Church (1982-2000), an Evangelical/Charismatic church

In March of 1998, while reading the apostolic fathers and subsequent church history in preparation for a Wednesday evening bible study, he discovered the Church to be charismatic/liturgical, hierarchical, and Eucharistic-centered. In light of that discovery, he and his wife, Donna began a two-year journey into the Catholic Church that culminated in fifty-four members of his previous congregation, including fourteen members of his family, entering the Catholic Church. They entered the R.C.I.A. program at St. Suzanne Catholic Community on September 10, 2000, and were welcomed into the Catholic Church through confirmation during Easter Vigil on April 14, 2001.

Deacon Jones will address topics such as Black History Month, his journey to Catholicism, the power of the

Sacraments in our lives, stewardship, and the season of Lent.

2. HOW TO PRAY
