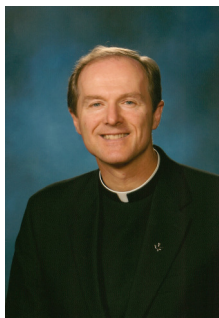

**1. LENTEN FAST AND ABSTINENCE REGULATIONS:**

**Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting.** Catholics who are **ages 18 to 59** are obliged to fast, that is, take only one full meal and two lesser meals, with nothing to eat in between meals. Drinking fluids would not be contrary to the practice of fasting.

**Ash Wednesday, the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday are days of abstaining from meat.** All Catholics who are **14 years of age and older** are obliged to abstain from eating meat.

**2. STATIONS OF THE CROSS:**

Stations of the Cross will be offered every Friday at 6 PM. Good Friday at 3 PM. All are welcome!
