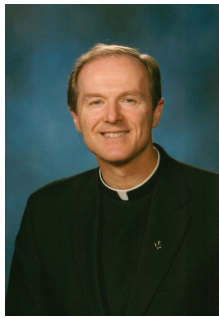

**c.) Glory be to the Father (seven times).**
