**1. MEMORIAL MASS, NOVEMBER 2**

Last year, in early November, we offered a special Mass on a Monday evening to honor our beloved dead, all those souls who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith. We will begin the evening with a candle lighting ceremony at 5:30 PM during which the names of all those you wish to have remembered will be called out and a candle will be lit in their memory. (We will invite a family member to come forward to light the candle.) Sign up sheets for those you wish remembered will be found in the foyer of the Church. Then we will celebrate the Mass and have a dinner following the Mass. A guest speaker will be invited to the dinner to speak about grief and working through life's transitions.
