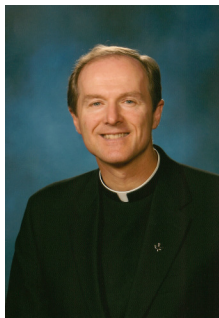

**FROM THE
PASTOR**



Dear Parishioners,

1. MEMORIAL MASS, NOVEMBER 2

Last year, in early November, we offered a special Mass on a Monday evening to honor our beloved dead, all those souls who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith. We wish, once again, to offer the same special evening. We will begin the evening with a candle lighting ceremony at 5:30 PM during which the names of all those you wish to have remembered will be called out and a candle will be lit in their memory. (We will invite a family member to come forward to light the candle.) Sign up sheets for those you wish remembered will be found in the foyer of the Church. Then we will celebrate the Mass and have a dinner following the Mass. A guest speaker has been invited to the dinner to speak about grief and working through life's transitions. We hope you will consider coming to this special evening.

2. DEATH PENALTY DISCUSSIONS:

Senator Carolyn McGinn, a parishioner of Holy Savior, will be speaking at St. Vincent de Paul Church on the death penalty on Monday, October 26, beginning at 7:00 PM. This is another opportunity for each of us to ponder the current laws of Kansas, which allow for capital punishment.

3. BISHOP CARROLL/KAPAUN MT. CARMEL

All students who attend either Bishop Carroll Catholic High School or Kapaun Mt. Carmel Catholic High School will be required to meet with me in order to sign a Parish/Family Agreement Form.

Parents and students must be present at these meetings. I will send you a letter informing you of the time and date of the meeting. I hope to spend approximately 20 minutes with each family. These meetings will begin on November 10.

4. MISCELLANEOUS GIFTS

You will notice, for the next several weeks, an increase of money in the area we call "Miscellaneous Gifts." The increased giving in this area will be due primarily to the receipts from the Katherine Drexel Fund (previously known as the Fall Appeal). From the information I sent you a few weeks ago, please note that we still need \$8,250 in the collection each week in order to meet the demands of our budget, not including the miscellaneous gifts.
