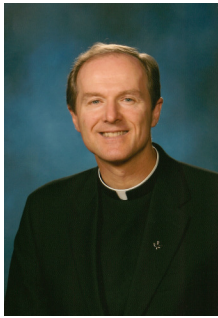

FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

1. MEMORIAL MASS ON NOV. 2

I sincerely wish to thank those who helped to make this evening so special: Williamae White, Shreda Johnson, and Anita Guidry who did much of the organization work for the evening; the choir under the direction of Mr. Huron Breaux who sang beautifully; Christy Mba who provided an excellent dinner; Angel Ingram, Leslie Hamilton, and Kathleen Ross for decorating and hosting the evening; Rita Willis the Hospice speaker who spoke at the dinner. I am very thankful for all the help we received to make the evening so wonderful. I know you will join me in thanking those mentioned above.

2. GOOD LEADERS, GOOD SHEPHERDS

I will be away from the parish on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday morning and afternoon of next week in order to continue my leadership formation in the program Good Leaders, Good Shepherds.

3. STRENGTHENING FAMILIES

The Center for Health and Wellness is sponsoring a special program for families and children ages 8 through 16. This program is designed to help parents more effectively interact and communicate with their children and help children and youth work through the challenges of peer pressure.
